- 2) A student is required to receive a course credit for both modules: **Methodology of Linguistic Research** and **Methodology of Literary Research** within the 1<sup>st</sup> year of studies (both are offered twice in semester 1 and semester 2).

**Elective course:** to be selected out of courses on specific linguistic and literary domains as well as interdisciplinary courses in each academic year.

**Module of Social Sciences:** to be selected out of courses on social sciences, psychology, history of philosophy, aesthetics, contemporary culture, economics, media sciences and introduction to law.

**Course(s) offered by the university:** compulsory module(s) offered by the University of Warsaw for 3 ECTS points in total per one year, i.e. in semester 1 or semester 2.
